Meeting Notes

- Meeting started at 6:00 pm.
- Current Sponsorship Policy was distributed and discussed.
- The assignment of the Sub-Committee is to review existing policy and discuss potential opportunities to expand policy to allow sponsorship banners / signage at City parks. The policy would outline guidelines and procedures. The goal is to obtain additional sponsorship revenue that could help "off set" annual field maintenance costs and potentially help keep the Sports Organization User Fees at a minimum. The policy is intended to give guidance for accepting sponsorships while still maintaining the park looks, aesthetics and operational use.
- Some ideas discussed included:
 - Define locations at parks (baseball / softball field fences, back of 5-tier bleachers, etc.) ensuring that these locations were viable exposure for a business, but not block the operational needs of programs.
 - Define banner sizes for each location and the maximum number of banners permitted at each location.
 - Banners should be of similar format and be a one-color print to keep uniformity for better appearance.
 - o Timeframe of sponsorship should be for one year.

- Define the set costs that would provide a range of financial impact to a business based on size of banner and location. This would allow them the ability to pick which package best fits their need and budget when considering sponsorship.
- Consider providing multi-year discounts if the business pays full fees for the multiple years up-front and perhaps offer multi-park discounts.
- It is also important to give notice to the sponsoring business either 90 days or 120 days in advanced of their end date to give the business the "first right of refusal" to re-new.
- Staff will research local municipalities that offer sponsorship opportunities to share with the Sub-Committee and prepare a draft for discussion at the next meeting. The tentative date for the next meeting is Wednesday, March 30th at 5:30 pm, pending everyone's availability.
- There was also discussion to potentially include the executive team of the Chamber of Commerce at a future meeting once the proposed policy is a little more defined for their input as well.
- The meeting concluded at 7:00 pm.
