GENERAL RULES AND PROCEDURES CITY OF PARKLAND CITY COMMISSION MEETINGS

WHO MAY SPEAK

Meetings of the City Commission are open to the public. They are not however, public forums. Any resident who wishes to address the Commission, on any subject within the scope of the Commission's authority, may do so providing it is accomplished in an orderly manner and in accordance with any procedures outlined below:

A. SPEAKING ON ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

- 1. CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS: These are items which the Commission does not need to discuss individually and which are voted on as a group. Any Commission member who wishes to discuss any individual item on the consent agenda may request the Mayor to pull such items from the consent agenda. These items pulled will be discussed and voted upon individually.
- 2. **REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:** These are items which the Commission will discuss individually in the order listed on the agenda. After the Commission has discussed an item on the agenda, the Mayor will close Commission discussion and may inquire as to whether any citizen wishes to be heard on the matter.

B. SPEAKING ON SUBJECTS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Any resident may address the Commission on any item not on the agenda during public input.

ADDRESSING THE CITY COMMISSION, MANNER, TIME

Individuals will be limited to three minutes speaking time. All comments or questions of the public are to be directed to the Mayor as presiding officer only. There shall be no cross conversations or questions of any other persons. Citizens wishing to be heard shall raise their hands until acknowledged by the Mayor. Once acknowledged, those citizens shall come forward and state their name and address. Anyone wishing to speak a second time on the same subject must receive permission from the Mayor.

<u>DECORUM</u>

In order to adjourn a City Commission meeting, it must be voted on by the members of the Commission.

C. Ordinance 2023-003: Amending Future Land Use Map to Park (Second Reading)

An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, amending the Future Land Use Map to change the designation of approximately 39.5 gross acres from Palm Beach County Rural Residential (1 DU/10 AC) and Parkland Residential (2DU/AC) to Park for the property located on the northeast corner of Hillsboro Boulevard and Nob Hill Road; as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" (Case number LUPA23-001); and providing for an effective date.

D. Ordinance 2023-008: Comprehensive Plan Amendments (First Reading)
An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, amending the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan by amending the Land Use Element to establish certain permitted uses in areas designated commercial, and amending the Future Land Use Element map to reflect said changes; and providing for an effective date.

E. <u>Ordinance 2023-006: Land Development CodeText Amendment - Self Storage (First Reading)</u>

An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, amending the City of Parkland Land Development Code, by amending Article 5, "Administrative and Legal Provisions", Section 5-3530 "Terms Defined" to add a definition of "Self-Storage Facility" and amend the definition of "Storage Warehouses"; amending Article 10, "Districts"; Sections 10-4500 "Purpose of Districts", 10-4505 "Uses Permitted"; and 10-4520 "Site Development Standards and Dimensional Requirements for B-1, B-2, B-3, S-1, BCB-3 and OP Zoning Districts" to create the S-1 Zoning District, list the uses permitted and enumerate

the development standards applicable within the S-1 District; amending Article 15 "Detailed Use Regulations" by creating Division 7, "Self-Storage Facilities" to provide for architectural design standards for self-storage facilities; amending Article 90 "Off-Street Parking and Loading"; Section 90-530 "Amount of Off-Street Parking" to provide parking standards for Self-Storage Facilities; providing for implementation, conflicts, severability, and an effective date.

- F. Ordinance No. 2023-009 - Stormwater Fee Assessment (Second Reading) An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, relating to the provision of services and capital facilities for stormwater management and the imposition of stormwater assessments related to those services and facilities throughout the incorporated areas of Parkland, Florida; providing definitions and legislative findings; establishing a stormwater utility and providing its responsibilities; establishing a stormwater utility fund; authorizing the imposition and collection of stormwater assessments to fund the cost of providing services and capital facilities for stormwater management; establishing procedures for notice and adoption of the stormwater assessments and the assessment roll and for correcting errors and omissions; providing that stormwater assessments constitute a lien on assessed property upon adoption of the stormwater assessment roll; establishing procedures and methods for the collection of stormwater assessments; establishing the priority of the stormwater lien over prior recorded liens or mortgages; providing for severability; providing for revisions and applicability; providing for exemptions; providing for interim stormwater assessments; providing for codification, severability, and conflicts; and providing an effective date.
