GENERAL RULES AND PROCEDURES **CITY OF PARKLAND CITY COMMISSION MEETINGS**

WHO MAY SPEAK

Meetings of the City Commission are open to the public. They are not however, public forums. Any resident who wishes to address the Commission, on any subject within the scope of the Commission's authority, may do so providing it is accomplished in an orderly manner and in accordance with any procedures outlined below:

A. SPEAKING ON ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

1. **CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS:** These are items which the Commission does not need to discuss individually and which are voted on as a group. Any Commission member who wishes to discuss any individual item on the consent agenda may request the Mayor to pull such items from the consent agenda. These items pulled will be discussed and voted upon individually.
2. **REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:** These are items which the Commission will discuss individually in the order listed on the agenda. After the Commission has discussed an item on the agenda, the Mayor will close Commission discussion and may inquire as to whether any citizen wishes to be heard on the matter.

B. SPEAKING ON SUBJECTS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Any resident may address the Commission on any item not on the agenda during public input.

ADDRESSING THE CITY COMMISSION, MANNER, TIME

Individuals will be limited to three minutes speaking time. All comments or questions of the public are to be directed to the Mayor as presiding officer only. There shall be no cross conversations or questions of any other persons. Citizens wishing to be heard shall raise their hands until acknowledged by the Mayor. Once acknowledged, those citizens shall come forward and state their name and address. Anyone wishing to speak a second time on the same subject must receive permission from the Mayor.

DECORUM

In order to adjourn a City Commission meeting, it must be voted on by the members of the Commission.

F. **Ordinance 2023-007: Rezoning Gator Acres from Single-Family Residential to Open Space/Recreation (First Reading)**

An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, rezoning approximately 3.96 acres generally located along the south side of Loxahatchee Road, approximately 1.9 miles west of Nob Hill Road, as being more particularly described in Exhibit "A", from RS-3 (Single Family Residential - 3 DU/Acre) to OS (Recreation / Open Space) providing for severability, conflicts and an effective date. (Case Number RZ23-002).

G. **Ordinance 2023-012: Amending the Land Development Code (Landscape Requirements) (Second Reading)**

Consideration of an Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of Parkland, Florida, amending the City of Parkland Land Development code by amending Article 95, "Landscaping and Vegetation", Division 5 "Generally", Section 95-515 "Documents incorporated by reference", Section 95-520 "Definitions", Section

95-1010 "General requirements - Tree removal and tree preservation" and Section 95-1555 "Removal of existing plant material", to incorporate standards by reference, add defined terms for "nuisance tree" and "unacceptable risk", provide permit exceptions for trees posing an unacceptable risk to persons or property on single family residential property, and to clarify permit requirements for removal of exotic species; providing for implementation, codification, conflicts, severability, and an effective date.
